Payment of Fees:

- 1 Once a student has been registered as attending at the start of an academic year, Tuition and Maintenance fees for the full year apply. Where a student withdraws or suspends study from a course during the year, the full fees for the year are still due.
- 2 Tuition fees can be paid in full at the start of the academic year and a discount of 0.5% will be given if fees are paid by 20 October (the discount does not apply to Student Loan payments or one-off charges). Alternatively, payment of Tuition fees can be spread over 3 equal instalments, to be paid by 20 October, 20 January and 30 April, unless otherwise agreed.
- 3 Unpaid fees are liable to incur a late payment penalty of £10 per month until the balance is cleared. Where part-payment of instalments are made, these will be used first to clear Maintenance Fees and then Tuition Fees. Failure to keep up with the schedule of payments normally results in termination of studies.
- 4 Fees shown are applicable only for the current academic year and are likely to rise, normally in line with inflation, in future years.

Notes:

- a Registration is a one-off charge that applies to all students. It must be paid prior to the start of the course, and is not refundable.
- b The discounted registration charge will apply for all students registering before 31 May, or those registering within two weeks of the offer of a place.

Additional South West Regional Centre charges:

For students whose placements are set up through South West Youth Ministries (SWYM), some additional costs are met by the student's supporting Placement Partner.

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- 2 Tuition and Maintenance fees can be paid in full at the start of the academic year and a discount of 0.5% will be given if fees are paid by 20 October (the discount does not apply to Student Loan payments or one-off charges). Alternatively, payment of Tuition and Maintenance fees can be spread over 3 equal instalments, to be paid by 20 October, 20 January and 30 April, unless otherwise agreed.
- 3 Unpaid fees are liable to incur a late payment penalty of £10 per month until the balance is cleared. Where part-payment of instalments are made, these will be used first to clear Maintenance Fees and then Tuition Fees. Failure to keep up with the schedule of payments normally results in termination of studies.
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Notes:

- a Residential Maintenance fees cover the term-time provision of a furnished room, meals on a full-board basis, use of the College washing machines, light and heat. Students in a standard room may be required to share with a Foundation student for one or two nights per week – no reduction will be given for this.
- b Non-resident Maintenance fees cover meals and hot drinks. Lunch is provided for Campus-Based students on term-time weekdays. Placement-Based students have lunch provided one day per week during term-time, with lunch and evening meal provided during block weeks; accommodation (B&B) during block weeks may be available at an extra charge as above.
- c Maintenance fees for Foundation students cover term-time provision of lunch on two days per week and, if required, residential accommodation (usually in a shared room) for one (or two) nights per week with evening meal and breakfast.
- d Registration is a one-off charge that applies to all students. It must be paid prior to the start of the course, and is not refundable.
- e The discounted registration charge will apply for all students registering before 31 May, or those registering within two weeks of the offer of a place.
- f The annual levy amount is set by the student representatives of the Christchurch Campus Community Council and collected on their behalf by the College. As a guide, the amount in 2018/19 was £50 for Campus-Based students, and £25 for others.

Payment of Fees:

- 1 The fee for each taught module is due in full by the end of the first Study Block of that module. Once started, the full module fee is due, even if the student withdraws partway through a module. The fee for the Dissertation is normally due at the start of the third academic year. The annual enrolment fee is due at the start of each academic year but, in the first two academic years, can be paid at the same time as the first module payment.
- 2 Students may only proceed to the next stage of study if fees for the previous stage have been fully paid.
- 3 Fees shown are applicable only for the above academic year and are likely to rise, normally in line with inflation, in future years.

Notes:

- a The enrolment fee is payable for every year the student is enrolled in the MA, whether or not modules are taken.
- b Students require 180 CATS points for the MA and normally take modules totalling 60 CATS points per year.
- c The registration charge is payable prior to the start of the course. This is a one-off charge and is not refundable.
- d The discounted registration charge will apply for all students registering before 31 May, or those registering within two weeks of the offer of a place.
- e Each module fee includes lunch and evening meal (as applicable) during Study Blocks but not overnight accommodation. If required, this should be booked in advance and paid for during the Study Block. Accommodation and meals at other times outside the Study Blocks may be possible – these must be booked in advance with Reception and paid for during the stay.



Charges for specific/optional degree course elements

- Retake of a BA module (assessed) 50% of normal module tuition fee
- Auditing a BA module (not assessed) 25% of normal module tuition fee
- Reassessment of BA assignment £25
- BA mode change (for following academic year) £35 to 31 May, £100 from 1 June

Charges for specific/optional student facilities

- Photocopying and printing 5p per copy (via personal Papercut account)
- Hire of bedding (by residential students) £30 per term (plus £10 refundable deposit)
– Note: *Students are responsible for laundry and return of bedding at end of each term*

Additional facility charges for students and guests

For meals/accommodation required by students beyond that normally provided within their course (see Maintenance Fees), or for occasional guests. Many of these charges are on an honesty basis, and should be settled with integrity, as quickly as possible, at Reception. Students must complete room/meal booking forms (from Reception) for guests. The option for sharing a student's room at Christchurch campus is for genuine guests and does not include current College students.

Payment of Fees:

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- 2 Tuition and Maintenance fees can be paid in full at the start of the academic year and a discount of 0.5% will be given if fees are paid by 20 October (the discount does not apply to Student Loan or Placement Partner payments). Alternatively, payment of those fees can be spread over 3 equal instalments, to be paid by 20 October, 20 January and 30 April, unless otherwise agreed.
- 3 Unpaid fees are liable to incur a late payment penalty of £10 per month until the balance is cleared. Where part-payment of instalments are made, these will be used first to clear Maintenance Fees and then Tuition Fees. Failure to keep up with the schedule of payments normally results in termination of studies.
- 4 Fees shown are applicable only for the current academic year and are likely to rise, normally in line with inflation, in future years.

Notes:

- a This fee covers the use of College accommodation and meals during three block weeks at Moorlands Christchurch campus. It also covers lunches and hot drinks during block weeks at the Regional Centres. For students at SW Regional Centre, this fee is normally paid directly by the student's supporting Placement Partner.
- b Registration is a one-off charge that applies to all students. It must be paid prior to the start of the course, and is not refundable.
- c The discounted registration charge will apply for all students registering before 31 May, or those registering within two weeks of the offer of a place.

Additional charges at Midlands and South East Regional Centres:

There are four block weeks held locally at Midlands and SE Regional Centres in Year 1, reducing to three block weeks in Years 2 and 3. The costs of lunch and teas/coffees during these block weeks are covered in the maintenance fees above. You should arrange and pay for your own accommodation and other meals during those weeks, as needed.

Additional charges at South West Regional Centre:

For students who are linked in to the South West Youth Ministries network and whose placements are set up through SWYM, the additional local costs of the course are met by the student's supporting Placement Partner. As indicated in note a, the Maintenance Fees are also normally paid by the Placement Partner.
