Key duties will include:

- Working alongside the Chaplain with Special Responsibility for Female Students to:
 - Deliver and arrange appropriate Chaplaincy support for students across all the College's programmes and modes of delivery
 - Provide one-to-one pastoral support and care of students in person at MCC and online at other Centres as required.
 - Ensure efficient operation of the booking system for student Chaplaincy meetings in liaison with the Adminstration Team.
 - Attend and support Tutor Groups and Placement-Based Champion Groups at MCC as appropriate.
 - o Be an effective communicator of the role of Chaplain in the College.
 - Work with the Student Welfare Manager to ensure cohesion and proper process within the College's student welfare structures and systems.
 - Work in collaboration with the Student Welfare Manager to signpost students to external professionals and services when appropriate.
 - Liase with the HR Manager to advise on (but not deliver) distinct pastoral support of staff as required.
 - o Consult with the Chair of the Welfare Panel and Safeguarding Lead in line with the College's policies and procedures for student welfare.
 - o Participate in meetings of the Pastoral Strategy Team.
 - o Provide support for off-timetable/discipleship/retreat/quiet days as required.

- Advise students on specialist resources and training e.g. on mentoring, self-care etc.
- Contribute to College worship services and prayer meetings as arranged Give independent advice to students throughout the Complaints Procedure.
- Provide chaplaincy support more specifically to male students, through one-to-one and small group meetings, advice, encouragement and referral appropriate to issues faced generally or more distinctively by them as men.

 Positive and flexible approach. Ability to work independently as well as part of a team Ability to pastorally support students.
