Indicative syllabus	 The module comprises: A biblical and theological understanding of Christian leadership in the context of the local congregation; Models of church planting and church growth; Developing missional strategies; Church practice and polity; Everyday church practice such as corporate gatherings, rites of passage, marking seasons, etc.; The theory and practice of preaching; Understanding relevant legal frameworks such as employment; Handling theological tensions; The impact of context on church life; The exercise and dynamics of power at local and national levels.
