Moorlands is a non-denominational college based just outside Christchurch in Dorset. Our passion is that education is transformative and impactful. We have delivered Higher Education programmes, validated by the University of Gloucestershire, since 1995, and approximately 1,500 people have graduated with a Bachelors or Masters degree.

We are focused on four primary goals:

- 1. To increasingly equip students to impact the church and world This grounds us as a discipleship-orientated, supportive community, developing resources for flexible delivery, building research capacity, and broadening the

portfolio of courses offered.

- 2. To secure financial sustainability

While the global pandemic has a lasting legacy, we are focused on ensuring a robust business model that will take us into the future. This includes increasing income from non-HE provision, increasing efficiencies in our work, and working on a sustainable recruitment model.

- 3. To achieve greater independence and security through receiving **Degree Awarding Powers**

Given suitable conditions, the College will look to apply to the Office for Students for DAPs, which has been a long-term aspiration of the College.

- 4. To ensure staff are well supported and equipped to deliver their roles

The greatest asset of the College is the staff team, and work is being done to strengthen our people management, in particular improving communication and inspiring a positive working culture.
