Why make a will?



Ensure that, when you are no longer here, your loved ones are looked after



Ensure that your wishes are carried out



Ensure the causes you care about can continue to transform lives





Consider the type of gift you would like to leave in your will



Specific Sum

This is a gift of a set amount of money, also known as a 'pecuniary gift'.



A specified item

This could be something of value such as jewellery, a painting, property or shares.



A share of your estate

Also known as a 'residuary gift', this is a percentage of what remains of your estate after all other gifts and expenses have been paid. Many people choose this as it allows you to provide for your loved ones and then leave a gift to Moorlands. There is no typical or standard percentage. However large or small, your gift will make a difference.

How to leave a gift in your will

Once you've looked after your family and friends, including a gift in your will to Moorlands is an incredible way to help equip future generations to impact the church and world.

I already have a will

If you wish to give an amount of money or a specific item to Moorlands in your will, please complete the codicil form at the back of this booklet and store it safely alongside your will. The request on the codicil will be carried out in addition to your wishes in your original will.

If you wish to remove anything in your will, or leave a share of your estate to Moorlands College, please ask a solicitor for advice.

I don't have a will

Add the details of your desired gift at the time of writing your will. We recommend you find a qualified solicitor to prepare your will, which can be done cost effectively.

Alternatively, for a straightforward will, you can find the necessary forms to download online or via a reputable stationer's shop. If you are in any doubt about the process or paperwork, we recommend you seek legal advice.

Codicil form

This form should only be used, in conjunction with your existing will, to give an amount of money or a specific item(s) to Moorlands. Keep this form safe with your will. To remove anything in your will, or to leave a share of your estate to Moorlands College, ask a solicitor to advise you. If you haven't yet made your will, you won't need this form.
