Module Type	Standard Taught Module
Brief description	This module equips students to engage with the Book of Acts with critical awareness of the hermeneutical methods used. In particular, this module enables students to consider both literary and historical critical readings of Acts, and reflect on how these approaches inform interpretation. There is a focus on the role of the Holy Spirit and the nature and means of 'mission' in Acts. Moreover, this module addresses how Acts contributes to the wider fields of pneumatology and missiology. As with the programme as a whole, there is a strong emphasis on students' own context and practice. Therefore, the module encourages students to reflect throughout the module on how their own context informs their reading of Acts and how Acts informs their missional practice.

Indicative syllabus	This module covers a range of topics relating to: biblical hermeneutics; the Book of Acts; Lukan and Pauline pneumatology; missional paradigms, particularly <i>missio Dei</i> ; the role of the church in mission; the nature and communication of the gospel, particularly cross-culturally; signs and wonders in Acts and today; the students' own context and missional practice.
Learning outcomes	A student passing this module should be able to: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. demonstrate advanced methodological awareness in their interpretation of biblical text(s), including engagement with relevant debates regarding biblical hermeneutics; 2. discern and synthesise key features of Luke's pneumatology in Acts, demonstrating critical awareness of Luke's particular contribution to New Testament pneumatology; 3. reflect theologically and critically on an area of their own missional practice and context, demonstrating critical awareness of debates regarding the nature and priorities of 'mission'.
