Brief description	<p>This module introduces students to the practical, biblical and theological study of being a Christian leader in a variety of contexts. It allows students the opportunity to develop a broad knowledge and understanding of competencies, paradigms, models, and frameworks central to the formation of mature Christian leaders, assessing their strengths and weakness. It includes the study of Christian character and virtue. This module also helps the student to progress in their awareness of their capabilities in key areas and engages them in processes of self-reflection in order to develop interpersonal, communication, cognitive, intellectual, and enabling skills.</p> <p>A regular placement provides a grounding in practice for the learning of the module.</p>

Indicative syllabus	<p>The module comprises:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • An overview of the biblical and theological paradigms, models and frameworks central to Christian formation and leadership, including the examination of key biblical texts; • Identifying current points of tension, emphasis, and de-emphasis in these paradigms in contemporary Christian ministry and church life; • Working with others, teamwork and developmental group work including the establishment of boundaries, dealing with crisis and conflict and communication in varied contexts and settings; • Understanding and discerning vocation, calling, and future orientations; • Safeguarding and risk management; • A critical examination of the tensions, similarities and differences between discipling, coaching, mentoring, teaching, managing, and leading; • An overview of concepts of worship, virtue, character development and spiritual formation; • A critical discussion of spiritual disciplines and the practices that promote spiritual growth; • Theological reflection, self-awareness and being able to link theory and practice; • Training in skills development to allow students to thrive in varied practice settings.
