<b>Brief description</b>	<p>This module focuses primarily on church leadership in the local missional congregation. The module aims to give students an understanding of issues in contemporary church life in which theory and practice interact with each other. Students are encouraged to consider the priorities of building spirit-filled, Christocentric congregations that facilitate fellowship, worship, biblical teaching, and local and global impact. Participants will gain an increased awareness of both the character and skills required to lead a local congregation.</p> <p>A regular placement provides a grounding in practice for the learning of the module.</p>

<b>Indicative syllabus</b>	<p>The module comprises:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• A biblical and theological understanding of Christian leadership in the context of the local congregation;</li> <li>• Models of church planting and church growth;</li> <li>• Developing missional strategies;</li> <li>• Church practice and polity;</li> <li>• Everyday church practice such as corporate gatherings, rites of passage, marking seasons, etc.;</li> <li>• The theory and practice of preaching;</li> <li>• Understanding relevant legal frameworks such as employment;</li> <li>• Handling theological tensions;</li> <li>• The impact of context on church life;</li> <li>• The exercise and dynamics of power at local and national levels.</li> </ul>
